MFT Terminal	1 st Japan vessel Wild Peony completed loading and departed 14 th May 21h00pm. Intakes are flowing into the terminal steadily.
FPT Terminal	1 st Japan vessel Uruguay Star completed loading and departed 15 th May 13h00pm. 2 nd Japan vessel Andalucia Star in port planned to commence 23 rd May. Intakes are flowing into the terminal steadily.
General	All smooth flowing and no major delays on trucks recorded so far this week. Citrus intakes into Durban appear sluggish at this time with an increase expected from week 21. Container loading volume in Durban is increasing and there have been no major obstructions detected during the week. The DRCOF met this week with minutes of the meeting available on request. 725 Citrus containers expected to load out of Durban and 4 Specialized Reefer Ships calling Durban this week loading out an expected 27,000 pallets from stock. Durban cold stores appear to be well positioned to accept next week's citrus intakes.
