2. FPT Terminal & Durban Container Terminal Operations Update

Terminal	Comments
DCT Pier 1	No delays to reefer containers entering the terminal at present. It is expected that there will be a high number of protocol reefers delivered to Pier 1 this week for the ASASE bound vessels (Japan, China and Korea especially). This has been communicated to Pier 1 management.
DCT Pier 2	No delays to reefer containers entering the terminal at present. . There are concerns as to the oversupply of reefer containers into Pier 2 from today, this could be a problem for reefer plug-in capacity but will be monitored. This has been communicated to Pier 2 management whom have responded.
Maydon Wharf CT	No problems. It is reported there is a limited supply of plug-in points at MW. The Maersk/Safmarine Med service is operated from the MW berth.
FPT Terminal	The 5 th Japan vessel will start loading Wednesday 14h00. This would ease some pressure on the terminal space wise – currently 12,000 pallets of Japan cargo in stock. There are presently a high volume of reefer containers for Japan and Korea forecast this week. Truck delays have not been a problem this week so far but could build up later in the week.
General	There are 15 container vessels loading reefer containers this week with a total forecast of 1,200 FEU's to be loaded and delivered to DCT = 24,000 pallets. There are 3 break-bulk vessels loading at FPT this week with a possible 8,000 pallets. Total pallets forecast to load out of Durban this week = 34,000 pallets. Kindly note that there is a very high volume of citrus reefer containers forecast from this week on, it has been communicated to DCT management. All stakeholders are advised to check empty reefer container stock availability and confirmed bookings with the lines to ensure bookings are met in line with forecasts.
