

Citrus Connect improves citrus shipping routes from South Africa

With dedicated connections from Durban and Port Elizabeth, Citrus Connect is strengthening transport options for temperature-sensitive citrus cargo to North Europe, South Europe, Portugal, Canada, and the U.S. For the current season, transit times to Portugal have also been improved, providing exporters with additional shipment options.

Additional operational support is also being provided during the peak citrus season to support the movement of cargo from South Africa to international markets.

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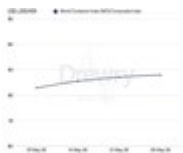
