Citrus Academy short courses are aimed at providing snapshot insight into the essential components of the citrus production system. Short courses provide a good induction into the subject matter, aid understanding of how that component fits into the wider production system, and

serve as a good starting point for those who would like to launch a career in that aspect of the system.

The Citrus academy covers the three main components of the system through the Citrus Production, Citrus Packing and Citrus Export Supply Chain short courses. These are supported by the widely applicable Citrus Business Administration short course. All course attendants receive an attendance certificate upon completion

of the course. There is also an optional competency assessment for attendants to complete, after which they will receive a competency certificate. Upon request, the academy will also present courses onsite for organisations and farms.
