Striving to lend a helping hand

RBX group remains committed to giving back to our communities. As we continue to grow, we still put back into our communities with a large focus on early childhood development.

In the Citrusdal community, we are supporting 3 schools that educate a total of 185 children. We build relationships with these schools to determine the needs that they might have and see how we can assist them in their needs. Recently we provided learning materials in the form of books, stationery, puzzles and educational toys, along with wendy houses, paving, toilet facilities, kitchenware, air-conditioning units, cleaning materials and a television. All above served a purpose for these schools and assist them with one or more of their needs to create a

better environment for the children. Our team often visits these schools as well, taking along some treats which the children and staff enjoy.

In the Eastern Cape, we support the Kleinskool project in the Bethelsdorp community and we have supported this initiative in a few ways. Recently we made monetary donations which resulted in toilet facilities, some improvements at their creche on the premises and for items within the Swap Shop.

The project allows the community to collect any items within the area, hand them in at the premises for recycling and in return receive tokens which can be used at the shop. Roughly 2.5 tons of recyclable materials are being collected weekly by the community members to get their tokens to purchase food, clothes, stationery, etc. from the Swap Shop.

Additionally, our teams take part in days like Slipper Day. In May our team at the RB head office dressed for Slipper Day. This initiative created by the Reach for a Dream Foundation assists them with funding to alleviate the strain that life-threatening illnesses place on sick children and their families
